

Here are some important changes introduced:

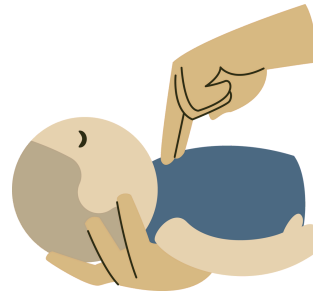
Compression-Ventilation

Prioritize high-quality compressions; trained rescuers add timely breaths, especially for drowning or suspected opioid cases.

Children's Depth

Compress 1/3 chest depth, not exceeding 2.4 in (6 cm).

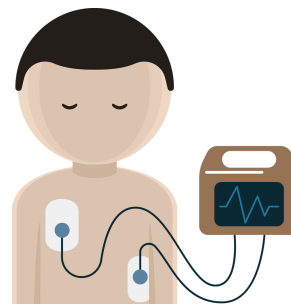
Infant Technique

Single rescuer: two-finger compressions;
Two rescuers: thumb-encircling.

AED for Kids/Infants

Apply ASAP (infants included); use pediatric pads/mode when available.

Opioid Response

Include naloxone; support breathing and continue CPR per protocol.
